

2017 WRITE-UP FOR CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CCA	Remarks
Art Club	The club caters to pupils who are interested in Art & Craft. Pupils will be put into 2 groups – Elite & Recreation. Pupils in the Elite Group will produce the art work for external competitions.
Chinese Dance Club	The club caters to pupils who are passionate about Chinese Dance. Pupils in the club will put up yearly performances at school events and compete in the biennial Singapore Youth Festival.
Modern Dance Club	The club caters to pupils who are passionate about Contemporary Dances. Pupils in the club will put up yearly performances at school events and compete in the biennial Singapore Youth Festival. Pupils may also get the opportunities to be involved in national events such as Chingay and National Day Parade.
Choir	The club caters to pupils who enjoy singing. Pupils in the club will put up yearly performances at school events and compete in the biennial Singapore Youth Festival. Pupils also get the opportunity to perform for the public at venues such as the Esplanade, University Cultural Centre and St Theresa's Home.
Artistic Gymnastics	The club caters to pupils who are interested in Artistic Gymnastics. Pupils will be put into 2 groups – School Team or Recreation. Pupils in the School Team are expected to train more than once a week. These pupils will be selected to represent the school at the National School Games in March/April. In addition, the school team members and selected pupils from the recreation groups will put up yearly performances at school events.
Rhythmic Gymnastics	The club caters to pupils who are interested in Rhythmic Gymnastics. Pupils will be put into 2 groups – School Team or Recreation. Pupils in the School Team are expected to train more than once a week. These pupils will be selected to represent the school at the National School Games in March/April. In addition, the school team members and selected pupils from the recreation groups will put up yearly performances at school events.
Tennis	The club caters to pupils who are interested in Tennis. Pupils are expected to train twice a week. Most training sessions will be conducted at public tennis courts. Transport to and from school to training venue will be provided for all players.
Netball	The club caters to pupils who are interested in Netball. All P5 and P6 netballers are expected to train twice a week. P4 pupils will train once a week and from the month of July, selected P4 pupils will be invited to train 2 to 3 times a week.
Drama Club	The club caters to pupils who are not only interested in performing but also in the production of plays. Pupils in the club get the opportunity to dabble with script writing and props making as well. Pupils put up yearly productions at school events.
Music Ensemble	The club provides the opportunity for musicians to come together for a 'jamming' session. Guided by our music specialist teachers, members get the opportunity to perform at major school events.

Sports & Fitness Club	The club offers opportunities for pupils who are keen to build up their fitness and sports skills. Activities conducted by the teachers-in-charge include games such as soccer and basketball dance and trekking. There will also be tips given by teachers on how to lead a healthy lifestyle.
Science & Environment Club	The club is for pupils who are interested in Science and Environmental issues. The club provides pupils with opportunities to learn and explore the environment through hands-on activities, research and investigation as well as collaboration with peers.
Information & Communications Technology Club	The club strives to enrich the members with IT skills through progressive training. Members will be given the opportunity to create animated backdrops for school events.
Badminton	This club offers badminton enthusiasts the opportunity to play the sport at recreation level. The pupils in this club will be coached by our own teachers.
Swimming	Priority will be given to pupils who have not obtained the SwimSafer Bronze Award. Transport to and from the swimming pool will be provided for by the school.
Brownies	This uniformed group will hold meetings, play games, sing songs, learn craft work and do test work. Pupils will take proficiency tests to get badges and be involved in community involvement projects.
